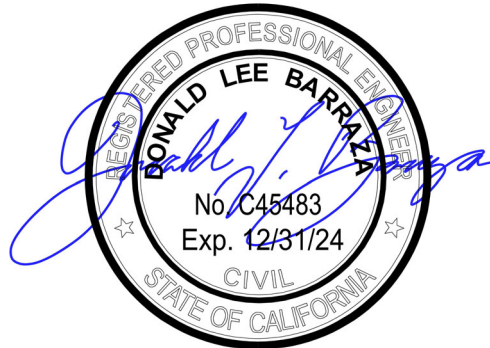

CHANGES TO SPECIFICATIONS

Item AD1-1 Section 00010: Invitation to Bid

Delete the word “mandatory” from paragraph 3 as follows:

“3. A **mandatory** pre-bid conference will be held on Tuesday, February 28, 2023 at 10:00 a.m. local time at the McKinleyville Community Services District Office (1656 Sutter Road, McKinleyville, California). A pre-bid site visit will be held immediately following the pre-bid conference.”

Item AD1-2 Section 00100: Instructions to Bidders

In Article 21. Pre-Bid Conference, replace the word “required” with the word “invited” as follows:

“Article 21. Pre-Bid Conference

A pre-bid conference will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 28, 2023 at the McKinleyville Community Services District Office (1656 Sutter Road, McKinleyville, California). Representatives of the Owner and the Engineer will be present to discuss the Project. Bidders are **invited required** to attend and participate in the conference. The Engineer will transmit to all prospective Bidders of record such Addenda as the Engineer considers necessary in response to questions arising at the conference.”

Item AD1-3 Section 00300: Bid Form

Replace Section 00300 Bid Form in its entirety with the revised Section 00300 Bid Form attached to this addendum. Changes have been made to the bid items contained in Article 5.

Item AD1-4 Section 00800: Supplementary Conditions

Add the following to the supplementary conditions:

SC 4.3.4(d)(viii) Modify as follows:

“(viii) ~~flood and tidal wave~~ insurance coverage for “Acts of God” as defined by California Public Contract Code Section 7105 shall be for 5 percent ~~the maximum percentage~~ of the Contract Price ~~permitted by law.~~”

Item AD1-5

Section 13201: Circular Prestressed Concrete Water Tanks

Modify paragraph 1.04 C. 1. as follows:

“1. Floor and footing joints for expansion and contraction as shown on the Drawing. A minimum of twelve (12) ~~fifteen (15)~~ vertical wall construction joints with PVC waterstop in each joint for ~~Reservoir No. 2. A minimum of fourteen (14) vertical wall construction joints with PVC water stop in each joint for Reservoir No. 1. A minimum of nine (9) vertical wall construction joints with PVC waterstop in each joint for the Clearwell.~~”

Article 1

The undersigned Bidder proposes and agrees, if this Bid is accepted, to enter into an agreement with Owner in the form included in the Contract Documents to perform and furnish all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents for the Contract Price and within the Contract Time indicated in this Bid and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.

Article 2

Bidder accepts all of the terms and conditions of the Invitation to Bid and Instructions to Bidders, including without limitation those dealing with the disposition of Bid Security. This Bid will remain subject to acceptance for sixty (60) days after the day of Bid opening. Bidder will sign and submit the Agreement with the Bonds and other documents required by the Bidding Requirements within fifteen (15) days after the date of the Owner's Notice of Award.

Article 3

In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents, as more fully set forth in the Agreement, that:

- (a) Bidder has examined copies of all the Bidding Documents.
- (b) Bidder has examined copies of the following Addenda (receipt of which is hereby acknowledged):

- (c) Bidder has familiarized itself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, site locality, and all local conditions and laws and regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work.
- (d) Bidder has studied carefully all reports and drawings of subsurface conditions and drawings of physical conditions which are identified in Section 00200, Information Available to Bidders.

Bidder has read and accepts the provisions in General Conditions paragraphs 3.3 through 3.5 which limit the extent to which the Contractor may rely on information provided by the Owner or the Design Engineer with regard to: a) subsurface soil conditions, b) existing concealed or underground utilities and underground facilities, and c) existing structures and facilities.

- (e) Bidder has read and accepts the provisions in General Conditions paragraphs 3.6 and 3.8 identifying the Contractor's responsibility: a) for using care in making excavations and in doing demolition, b) for damage to existing utilities and underground facilities and for loss of use thereof, and c) for the protection of workers and others from known and unknown or concealed hazards.
- (f) Bidder has read and accepts the provisions in General Conditions paragraph 3.7 which identifies the limited conditions under which the Contractor may be entitled to a change in Contract Time or Price due to differing or unknown conditions.
- (g) Bidder has visited the site and has reviewed the Bidding Documents and the Information Available to Bidders and it has made any other investigations, explorations or tests and has obtained any other data it considers necessary for preparation of its Bid.

Bidder has correlated the results of all such observations, examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports and studies with the Contract Documents and Bidder has read and understands provisions in the General Conditions relevant to differing and unknown conditions.

- (h) Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, or discrepancies that it has discovered in the Contract Documents and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Bidder.
- (i) Bidder has read, studied, and understands the entire set of Bidding Documents including the Construction Drawings, Specifications, and General Conditions and finds them fit and sufficient for the purpose of preparing its Bid and constructing the Work required.
- (j) Bidder represents that its Bid is based on providing all of the material, labor, equipment, and services necessary to complete the Work in full compliance with the Contract Documents without exception.

Article 4

Requirements for California Public Works and FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Contracts.

- (a) **DECLARATION OF LICENSE STATUS.** Bidder declares it will have a valid State of California Class A - General Engineering Contractor's license at the time of Contract Award.
- (b) **TRENCH SHEETING AND SHORING.** Bidder shall list on its Bid as a separate Bid Item costs associated with trench sheeting, shoring, and bracing for all trenching and excavation work 5 feet and deeper as required by Section 6707 of the California Labor Code.
- (c) **PREVAILING WAGE RATES.** The undersigned agrees that, if awarded the Contract, the undersigned and all of its subcontractors shall pay all laborers, workers, and mechanics employed in the performance of such Contract, or any subcontract thereunder, not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages and rates for overtime and legal holidays in the locality in which the work is to be performed, as ascertained and determined, by the statutes and regulations applicable thereto.
- (d) **NONCOLLUSION AFFIDAVIT.** In accordance with Public Contract Code Section 7106, Bidders are required to execute and submit with their Bid Document Number 00480 "Noncollusion Affidavit."
- (e) **USE OF BID DEPOSITORIES.** The Bidder declares that it has not used subcontractors' bids from a bid depository that in any way attempts to restrict, control, influence, or regulate free open price competition among subcontractors in the submission of their bids to prime Bidders.
- (f) **SECURITY FOR COMPENSATION CERTIFICATE.** Bidders are required to execute and submit with their Bid Document Number 00414 "Security for Compensation Certificate."
- (g) **REGISTERED WITH DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS.** No Contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid proposal for a public works project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 [with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)]
- (h) **SUSPENSION AND DEBARMENT.** This Contract is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180 and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000. As such, the Bidder by submitting their Bid Document is declaring that none of the Bidder's principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995) or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).

The Contractor must comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, and must include a requirement to comply with these regulations in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into.

This declaration is a material representation of fact relied upon by the Owner. If it is later determined that the Contractor did not comply with 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C, in addition to remedies available to the Owner, the Federal

Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment.

The Bidder agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. pt. 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. pt. 3000, subpart C while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any Contract that may arise from this offer. The Bidder further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

- (i) **BYRD ANTI-LOBBYING AMENDMENT, 31 U.S.C. § 1352 (as amended).** Bidders shall complete and submit with their Bid Document the certification provided in Section 00485. The following questions were posed during the pre-bid conference:

1. *Question:* The project is being funded in part by the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. Is the project then subject to the Buy American Act or American Iron and Steel requirements?
Answer: No. The Project is not subject to the Buy American Act or American Iron and Steel requirements. Furthermore, the Project is also not subject to the Build America, Buy America Act (BABAA) or to Davis Bacon wage rates. The Project is, however, subject to prevailing wages as set by the State of California Director of Industrial Relations.

2. *Question:* The geotechnical report (dated 2014 by LACO) indicates that in general the granular materials found on site were judged to be suitable for reuse as engineered/structural fill. The suitability of the native soils for reuse is not however guaranteed by the Owner. Does the Bidder then take on the risk/cost if the native soils end up being unsuitable for reuse as engineered/structural fill?
Answer: The bidding documents currently assign the risk/cost associated with reuse of the existing soils to the Bidder. However, Section 00300 Bid Form is being modified to include an additional unit cost bid item that will cover the cost of import fill material. This unit cost item will be used as directed by the Owner. It will only be used if the quantity of excavated native soils that meet the requirements for Engineered/Structural Fill is not sufficient for Contractor to achieve the final surface elevations shown on the Drawings. Material imported because of the Contractor's failure to handle, protect and properly stockpile excavated suitable native material will not be permitted under this bid item and will be at no additional cost to the Owner.

3. *Question:* The Contractor will be responsible for securing the necessary Humboldt County Grading Permit. What is the cost for this permit?
Answer: Exact cost is not known but is believed to be relatively minor. Bidders are encouraged to contact the county directly.

4. *Question:* Is there area available for temporarily stockpiling cut material (other than that shown as the area available for permanent stockpiling of material)?
Answer: Yes. The area immediately south and upslope of the new 4.5 MG reservoir will be available to the Contractor to temporarily stockpile cut material. The area proposed for temporary stockpiling is bounded to the south and east by the overhead power lines.
5. *Question:* PG&E is providing a new utility transformer and is running new underground power to the project site. How far along in the process is PG&E?
Answer: Final project coordination with PG&E was completed in October 2023. The PG&E Project Number is P000075462. The Engineer hopes to obtain design drawings March 2023. Once received by the Engineer, the drawings will be made available to Bidders for review.
6. *Question:* Has PG&E provided the Owner or Engineer with design drawings?
Answer: No. PG&E has not provided design drawings for the utility transformer and new power.
7. *Question:* Has lead time for equipment and material (e.g., the electrical equipment) been factored into the Contract Time?
Answer: Yes. Estimated lead times for electrical elements (e.g., MCC, standby generator, and utility transformer) were factored into the 600 days currently allowed for project completion.
8. *Question:* Will the Contractor (or Owner) be responsible for providing temporary power while the existing generator is being replaced?
Answer: The Contractor will be responsible for providing a temporary standby generator. Please see Section 01010 Summary of Work, specifically paragraph 1.07 B. 3.
9. *Question:* Will an automatic transfer switch be required for the temporary standby generator?
Answer: No.

10. *Question:* Acts of God Insurance is shown as a separate bid item on the Bid Form. What is it and does the Owner reimburse the Contractor for the cost of this coverage?
Answer: Acts of God are defined by California Public Contract Code Section 7105 as earthquakes in excess of 3.5 on the Richter Scale and tidal waves. With certain restrictions, Section 7105 states that public agencies cannot require contractors to be responsible for the cost of repairing or restoring damage from Acts of God in excess of 5 percent of the contracted amount. However, public agencies can require contractors to obtain insurance to cover costs greater than the stated 5 percent if the insurance premium is shown as a separate bid item. The cost of the insurance premium is part of the project cost. If the Owner ultimately selects the alternate bid item, it will be paid for by the Owner.
11. *Question:* What is the Engineer's estimate for the Project?
Answer: The Engineer's estimate is \$12.2 million to \$12.7 million.
